As I look back on my first nine months here at MUMC there are a few striking “feelings” I have. The first is “home”. By that I mean that I have felt accepted and loved from the very first day we worshipped together. There is a special sense of family here at MUMC that is genuine and deeply encouraging.

I am also *inspired* by the ways I have seen and heard and experienced God moving in the activities of the church. When a church goes through a pastoral transition, there is usually hesitation, uncertainty and even ministry standstill. But not here! God stirred in the midst of transition and presented us with opportunities for ministry and mission that has rekindled the spiritual life of our congregation and is moving us forward. I am inspired by God’s stirring and your response to it!

I am *excited* and *hopeful* for our future because of our first nine months together. God impressed on my heart very early on that we needed to interact on a more intimate level with the Morrisville community, and in particular, the Morrisville school. In just the past several months a Backpack Center has opened in our building, serving local families. In the month of October we have the opportunity to host some student athletes for a meal on Wednesdays, followed by personal testimonies by young people for young people on the love of Jesus.

We have experienced painful losses this year too. Some of our dear friends, family members, and strong leaders in the church have passed away or they are critically ill, leaving a sense of emptiness and loss which God is helping us through. Our All Saint’s service on November 1st will be a healing time for us to celebrate the lives and service of these precious children of God.

On October 21 we will have our first Charge Conference together, and in preparing for this annual meeting, I always pause to reflect on the past and plan for the future. What I have shared here are some of my reflections. It is good to pause, especially when life starts moving quickly, and reflect on what God is doing in your midst. I would invite you to take some time to do the same. What has God been doing in your life? Where is God leading you? Is there a new opportunity taking shape? How will you respond?

Once all of the shoe boxes are packed we will put a \$7 check (made out to Samaritan's purse) in each box, make sure they are wrapped and labeled; and then join together in prayer for the children who will receive them.

This year we made OCC the mission project for VBS. We got a great head start on collecting items to be used at our Shoebox packing party. Operation Christmas Child is a unique project of the Christian relief and evangelism organization Samaritan's Purse. Go to www.samaritanaspurse/occ.org to learn more.

Here are some suggestions for ways you can help:

- Purchase small gifts and items to place in shoeboxes (see suggestions Below)
- Save shoeboxes unwrapped or wrapped. (Please wrap the lid separately.)
- Donate money to be used toward shipping and handling costs.

Suggested Items:

Toys: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as stuffed animals, small dolls toy cars, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Non-liquid Hygiene Items: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.

Accessories: T-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

Crafts: Make your own items such as hair bows, finger puppets, and friendship bracelets.

Age and Gender-Specific Ideas:

Girls 2-4, Girls 5-9, Girls 10-14,
Boys 2-4, Boys 5-9, Boys 10-14.

Do Not Include: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.



On August 23rd we took a special offering from the congregation to support the September Golf Classic, which was a fund-raiser for the October Mission trip for Hurricane Sandy Relief. \$500 was raised that Sunday! Here is an up-date on what has been decided in regards to these two events.

Unfortunately, even though the Golf Classic has been a success for the past decade, this year we did not have enough participants register for the event to be a financial success this year, so the Classic was cancelled. Also, after sending a team into the Storm Relief Mission field for the past decade, we do not have enough volunteers to support a full team this year, so our trip to New Jersey in October has also been cancelled. The \$500 offering that was collected in August is going to be sent for Hurricane Sandy relief through UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) so every penny will be used as those who gave so generously intended.

While we are sad and disappointed that these two very important events have been cancelled, we feel very positive about the ministry opportunities that have come to us right here in the Morrisville area. Over the summer, a Back Pack Center has opened in the educational wing of our church, serving families in need in our own Morrisville School system. You have all contributed food and cleaning supplies to this ministry, and it is running smoothly. We will have a Blessing of the Backpack Center on November 11th.

We have also been invited to partner with Campus Crusade for Christ in the month of October in a very unique ministry with student athletes of the Morrisville school. Each Wednesday in October we will host a meal for the football players and Girls Field Hockey team, right here in our Fellowship Hall. WHY? So we can introduce ourselves to these precious children of God in a meaningful way, while sharing God's love.

Pastor's Fund Members of the church give generously to a small fund, administered anonymously by our pastor, for people in need or in crisis.

We offer financial assistance to **Livengrin**, a foundation for addiction recovery; **Ivan's House**, an organization located right here in Morrisville; **A Woman's Place, Family services of Bucks County, Advocates for the Homeless and Those in Need**, and other charitable organizations that we become aware of through the year.

Nationally

Mission trips. For the past decade our youth ministry has travelled around the East coast for week long summer mission trips, usually to help with storm devastation. A fall adult mission trip has also taken place each year to offer our hands and feet in service.

Globally

Operation Christmas Child is a Christian organization that reaches children in every corner of God's world, presenting the love of Christ in ways that "light up a child's heart". Our entire Church is collection gifts for shoe boxes that will be wrapped and delivered on Christmas day around the world. On Sunday, November 15th (Mission Saturation Sunday) we will come together in Fellowship Hall to pack and wrap and pray over these gift before sending them out.

As United Methodists, we are charged to be a light to the nations through our service, our prayers, and in our financial giving. We have partnerships with several nations in Africa; we support missionaries in every continent; and we have built hospitals, schools and orphanages in war torn or impoverished nations around the globe.

We are blessed to be a blessing to God’s children who struggle in this world for reasons of poverty, tragedy, addictions and unforeseen disruptive life events. A core value of our church is to help people in our local community, around the nation, and in all corners of the world.

Locally

We provide our services and our resources in partnership with several organizations:

Welcoming the Stranger provides free education for adult immigrants and refugees to the United States. We provide meeting space for these classes, encourage our members to be a tutor, and provide financial resources.

AHTN Advocates for the Homeless and Those in Need is a local organization that we work directly with in our daily requests from people with needs. On the third Tuesday of every month we provide a hot meal for 70-90 people from the lower Bucks area.

Food Closet We house a small food closet in our church so we always have food on hand for someone who might call or drop in with a specific hunger need.

Backpack Center A room in our building has been given to an Interfaith Backpack Center which gives food and household needs to families in need who attend the Morrisville schools.
