I found something that took my attention, a stone, but not any stone. It has an oval shape and, a dark brown color, and written on it was the word: "SLOW" inside a yellow rectangle. I still have it. By then I was in ministry and seminary full time. It was a very busy time. I took that as a message from God telling me to "SLOW" down". The message I heard was that we needed to slow down, not go ahead of God or behind Him, but walk step by step with Him. Returning to the classroom, I shared my experience and all of us were amazed with the message on the stone. We needed to slow down to develop intimacy with God! This thought is not just for Lent but for every day of our lives.
