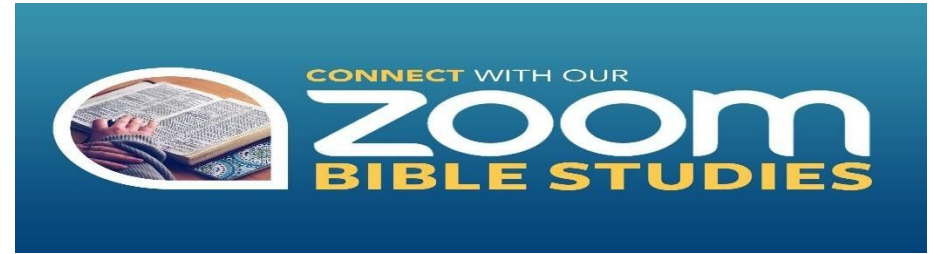
Live Stream Worship Sundays at 11:00 AM – or Anytime

Offerings to the General Fund are down slightly but so are the expenses so we have been able to pay our church staff, who are all working behind the scenes if not in front of the cameras, and also to pay our monthly expenses as well as our apportionments to the Conference. The really good news is that giving to the Communion Fund, which is used as the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, is up dramatically and is used to help those in the community who need assistance. I will be sending out giving statements in early June to update you on your giving for the first 5 months of the year. Please check it to ensure we have accurately recorded your giving. I thank you for your continued commitment and generosity to your church family and community.

Trustees Tool Box:

The Trustees continue their important work of maintaining our facilities. Thank you for all of your support. Here are some of the projects that the Trustees are working on:

- o **Landscaping and grounds:** We have been working to have the landscaping done and maintenance performed to keep our grounds beautiful.
- o **Additional security cameras-**To be installed soon in parking lot and main entrance driveway.
- o **Outdoor worship center-** The new fence has been installed. We are working to get the electrical box and lighting completed.
- o **Preparations for return to church building after COVID-19 crisis-** Although we do not know when this will occur we are procuring supplies and developing procedures for building use, social distancing, disinfection and others in accordance with guidance from the CDC and other sources.
- o **Parsonage air conditioning-** This project is now completed!!
- o **Shingle roof-** We are planning for replacement as it is now at end of life. We are working on obtaining several proposals for comparison.

Changes **AND** CANCELLATIONS

It is with very heavy hearts that we have needed to cancel our face to face ministries and mission projects over the past few months. These cancelations have forced us to look at our ministry together in new ways. Having some doors slammed shut, has helped us to open new doors to pursue new opportunities. This has been a gift to us and to our community.

On March 14 our building closed.

- The Montessori School changed to on-line and virtual learning.
- 12 Step programs are using zoom to continue to meet and offer support to one another.
- Our Food Closet moved to the lobby so our guests can continue to come and shop, but only by appointment. Gift cards are now being distributed to each guest to supplement their need for fresh produce, dairy and meat.
- The Back Pack Center changed their protocol, but continues to give food, gift cards and personal support to all 40 families.
- Our office closed in April, and Becky works from her home, checking on the phone messages and postal mail several times a week.
- Pastor Wendy works remotely and is available at any time by phone or email.
- Our in-person worship is now available 24 hours a day to anyone with a computer or access to you tube.
- Youth Group still meets – virtually!
- Meals are still prepared, but with a new protocol. Rather than a sit-down experience, take-out meals are provided several times a month. We have grown from 80-90 guests, to serving up to 150 guests.

Changes **AND** CANCELLATIONS

- After School programs stopped when school was cancelled. Care packages with school helps, craft ideas, and gift cards, are being shared with every After School Adventure family.
- Welcoming the stranger classes now meet virtually, continuing to meet the growing needs of their students.
- Vacation Bible School will not be held this summer in the usual way, If our building usage status changes, there may be an opportunity to reach the children of our community at some point, in some manner, but for now, we must cancel VBS.
- The United Methodist Women have cancelled the Rose Breakfast for the first time in 40 years.
- The Indoor Flea Market could not take place in April.
- All UMW circle meetings and large face to face meetings have been cancelled, but the UMW is looking into how to meet virtually.
- The Women's Retreat moved from January to May and is now rescheduled for September 18-20.
- The MyCalling Mission experience for Junior High Students from neighboring states, which meets in our building July 19-23 will not be able to happen this summer.

The effects of the pandemic are longer lasting than any of us at first imagined causing us to adjust hopes, plans and expectations. We are finding new paths, meeting new challenges, creating different time frames, and developing caring, helping relationships in creative ways. God is leading us through with courage and faith! Our partnerships with community organizations have deepened and broadened to provide meaningful support to our neighbors and friends both across the street and around the world.



As a church family we made a commitment to love and serve our neighbors both across the street and around the world in this time of national crisis because of the COVID 19 pandemic. Several members and friends of the church have made masks to share with medical workers and first responders – giving out hundreds of masks. Thank you for being generous with your time and material!

Our Food Closet has remained open and well stocked thanks to your willingness to shop and bring food to our doors. Gift cards are given to every guest, thanks to you mailing in and dropping off Giant Gift Cards. When you grocery shop for our food closet, what is needed most are personal hygiene items and canned meats. Pasta, pasta sauce and beans are plentiful at the moment. To date, we have given:

- \$5,000 to Salvation Army to help with the growing number of people coming in for a daily meal.
- \$1000 to Ivin Outreach Center.
- \$1000 to Conquering Life Prison and Recovery Ministry.
- \$1000 to IFA to purchase gift cards for our guests.
- \$500 to Livingrin to help people in recovery from addiction.
- \$4000 to Zoe Empowers. (Look for the picture of the children we have adopted in Liberia)
- \$1000 to AHTN (Advocated for the Homeless and those in Need).
- \$500 to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief)

In addition to the financial aid we are giving, we are also preparing freshly cooked meals for take-out almost every week. We do not know how long we will be kept from meeting face to face for fellowship worship and celebration – but we do know that we will continue to love one another in whatever way we are able to do so!



It's really scary how our lives can be changed on a sudden gust. From going out with family, school events and milestones, having friend get-togethers and going even to church, we have to stay at home. The daily grind of everyone had to be readjusted; it changed dramatically. Certainly, some of us may be, at this moment, experiencing some anxiety and a bit of loneliness. This is especially true for our youth. But the great news is - GOD is HERE and he loves us - he chases us. And we are chasing our YOUTH!

So what are we doing in YOUTH GROUP? I'm so glad you asked.

- o Janet and I delivered Youth Survival Kits to our youth. These kits were designed to help the kids feel connected and to receive a fun treat. These kits have fun items that we are using in our youth meetings.
- o We are meeting on zoom on Thursdays at 4:30. We have been experimenting with days and times to meet the needs of the group! So for now we have been meeting on Thursdays! Any changes will be made with the group and shared!!
- o Our recent youth group study is called - Storytime! Storytime is an experience where we are inviting guest speakers to come into our virtual meeting and sharing a bible story or parable with our group. Many of these stories were once told to us in Sunday School but this is a nice way to bring those stories back to life and enjoy the company of someone from our church family. So far we have had:

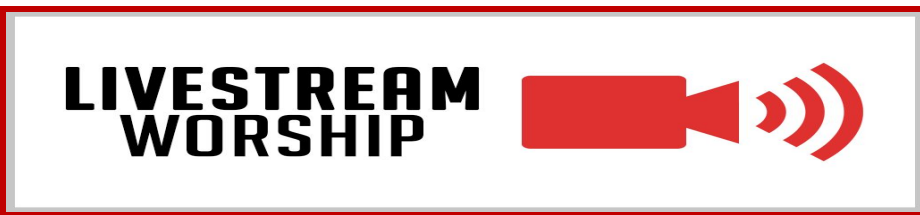
For an Earth Day activity, we presented each family with a large pot, soil and tomato seeds to plant for harvesting their own fruits in August/September.
